## District Advisory Notice: Huanglongbing (HLB) Citrus Disease

- Please be aware that an incurable plant disease called Huanglongbing (HLB) threatens the citrus crops of Southern California. While it is currently isolated to one area outside the district, the entire region is under quarantine by the California Department of Food and Agriculture.
- Because most of Southern California's citrus is in residential areas, you play an important role in helping to stop HLB and protecting our citrus.
- HLB is spread by an insect called the Asian Citrus Psyllid. There is information available to help you spot signs of these insects and the HLB disease.
